

**MINUTES**  
**Historic Preservation Commission**  
**June 6, 2019**  
**City Hall, 100 W. Woodstock Street, Crystal Lake, IL**

**1) Call to Order**

L. Solak, Chair called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

**2) Roll Call/Attendance**

The following Commission members were present: Hamilton Hale, Nancy Haskins, Diana Kenney, Lisa Solak, Ron Scherf, Bob Wyman, and Jim Wyman. Staff member Elizabeth Maxwell was present.

**3) Public Comment**

There was no public comment.

**4) Approval of Minutes of the May 2, 2019 Regular Meeting**

D. Kenney made a motion to approve the minutes of the May 2, 2019 regular meeting. B. Wyman seconded the motion. On voice vote all members voted aye. Motion passed.

**5) 200 West Woodstock Street – Certificate of Appropriateness**

James Parker was present to represent the petition. He explained that he is replacing his deck flooring with new Douglas Fir. They will also need to do some structural work. The pillars will be a PVC since the woodpeckers have damaged the cedar columns. Everything will be painted the same color scheme and to protect the wood. D. Kenney said she prefers the wood columns, but can understand about the woodpeckers being a continual problem. She also suggested he apply for a grant. H. Hale said this house has been lovingly taken care of. D. Kenney made a motion to approve the Certificate of Appropriateness. H. Hale seconded the motion. On voice vote all members voted aye. Motion passed.
